One of my all-time favorite Christmas movies is "Scrooge." It was taken from the book by Charles Dickens, "A Christmas Carol," written in 1843. Actually, this book saved Mr. Dickens from financial ruin. It became wildly popular for generations. In fact, approximately 20 movies about Scrooge have been made with different people playing the leading role.

My favorite is the 1951 British production starring Alastair Sim. I find his portrayal of the curmudgeon, Ebeneezer Scrooge, to be the most believable. If you know the story, it is all about living a life for a purpose that one would find most valuable. In the beginning of the story, Ebeneezer's focus is all about accumulating money and not spending one cent if avoidable (we all have at least one of those in our family). Mr. Scrooge is so focused on monetary gain that, when asked for support for the poor and destitute, his reply was, "Are there no prisons? Are there no workhouses? If I could work my will, every idiot who goes about with "Merry Christmas" on his lips should be boiled in his own pudding and buried with a stake in his heart. HUMBUG!" Even the loss of his partner in business did not faze his cold, hardened heart.

As you may already know, Ebeneezer was visited by three spirits, past, present, and future. These spirits show Mr. Scrooge the truth about the way he lived and the results of where he would end his life if something didn't change. It was a truly frightful, surreal, and life-changing experience for him. Ultimately, Ebeneezer's heart truly changed, and he became a champion of those who are in need. Although the book and the movie did not mention God as the inspiration of the life change Scrooge experienced, you can see the evidence of a divine hand in the script. I wonder...how many of us need to read the story of the "Christmas Carol" once again? You remember, of course, that the word Christmas actually means "Christ Mass," don't you?

So, as we journey to the cradle in Bethlehem, let us all reflect on the eternal meaning of our past, present, and mostly future lives in relationship with the Christ Child. Let us pray to be genuinely transformed from our old Scrooge into the new, redeemed creation God intends for us to be. Let's pray that this Christmas is the very best as we offer our lives as a gift to the risen Christ.
