SLEEP MAT DELIVERY A SUCCESS

On Sunday, May 5th, 29 crocheted sleep mats, pillows, straps, and care bags were blessed. They were divided and taken to four places. Some of these places need less in the summer and more in the winter months.



The mats were delivered to:

- * Lancaster, Foundation Shelter
- * Pickaway County Community Action Center
- * Stowe Mission
- * Ross County Community Action Commission

These four places are very appreciative of the work this group does. The homeless have a great need for items like these.

We do not get to see the results of the work. They are taken to these places and dropped off at a reception center, parking lot, or place in an office.

The homeless are sometimes perceived as people who don't want to work, etc. In reality, yes, there are a few like that. The real truth is that rent is so high that some senior citizens can no longer afford their housing, lose everything, and go to the streets, as there is no other choice. There are those who have lost limbs, can't work, or are too old or ill, and are now on the streets. Drug addiction has a tight hold on some, and they are stuck in that cycle. And of course, our veterans. There is a mentally ill population as well. There are families living in broken-down mobile homes with no water or heat. Then there are the ones who are living in cars.

Those who would like to get a job can't, as they have no address. The facilities mentioned above help as many as they can, but unfortunately, they can't help them all! There are success stories. Those that have beat the streets, fought their way up, and are doing well.

The items in the care packages are a wonderful gift for the moment and as long as they last. How hard it must be long-term to fight the rain, the storms from under a tree or cardboard box, or the wind when it blows everything away.

Imagine what it must be like to try to stay warm as the temperatures drop below freezing? How it must feel to wake up each day wondering where you will get your meals from. Do they wonder where they will do laundry, or shower? Do they try to find a place to do that? Can you imagine? Can you put yourself in their place?

What our church does is amazing! The giving of funds to provide what we do, the donation of the grocery bags, and the volunteers who dedicate time each month to working by sorting bags, flattening bags, fluffing strips, tying strips, and crocheting. Even the volunteers who work diligently at home.

What a gift our church is! God has truly touched our people and is guiding this mission. There has to be hope for this less fortunate group of people. We are all helping to make their lives better.

So, thank you to each and every one of you for your support and our ability to serve. You all make it happen. We have now given out 90 mats and care bags. Can you believe we will be over 100 in the fall? God surely has blessed us!

PICKAWAY COUNTY HOPESTRONG SCHOOL MINISTRIES

South Bloomfield Methodist Church is <u>NOT</u> considering having this program any time in the near future. We are, however, hoping to educate those in our community about this program, what it is, who it serves, and how volunteers make it work.

Hopestrong is one of the school released programs declared legal in the USA by the Supreme Court in 1952. Currently there are over 80 entities in Northern Ohio participating. Hedges Chapel, for example, has been in this program since spring of 2022. They started a pilot program with Walnut Elementary for second graders, to be held at the end of the school day, one day a week, for 7 weeks.

The kids' enthusiasm over the classes exploded and they told others. They initially received 8 parental consent forms, but by the first session there were 30 children attending. Midway through, the class became so large that it was extended to 2 classes a week. It ended with a total of 52 students. Volunteers stepped up and met the challenge.

Each lesson, song, and activity were Bible-themed. Each student received their own Bible to take home with them, wrote their name in it, and placed a bookmark at the Book of John for a place to begin reading.

The kids were taught about Creation, the Easter Story, the Bible, the 10 Commandments, the lost sheep and the lost coin, plus the Lord's Prayer.

At the end of every session, they were each given a treasure chest bag with usually 5 school supplies, 2 small toys, some crafts, a Bible themed book, and a CD or DVD of Christian songs or stories. The goal was to help them start building their own little Christian library in their homes.

In 2022-23 a third grade program began that alternated with a 4th grade program. The third grade program had 58 students. The fourth grade program served 27 students.

Volunteers sit at a table with the students, help them look up Bible verses, participate in the songs and motions to go along with the songs and guide the students while coloring, painting, or doing other activities. Volunteers come once or twice a week for usually 1½ hours. Each volunteer is generally assigned 3-4 kids. There are breaks for Pumpkin Show, a month-long winter break, and the week of Easter off.

A 5th grade class was added in 2024 with approximately 20 students. Classes are one day per week generally on Tuesdays or Thursdays during lunch/recess time. Pizza is provided for lunches. No academic classes are missed.

Major expenses for Hope Strong would include pizzas for each student each week requiring 600 pizzas/year, costing \$3,750. Bus expenses have averaged an additional \$5,000 per year for the last 3 years.

This an opportunity to volunteer and learn firsthand how to reach our own children in this community with the Gospel. This program's overarching goal is to instill hope in students through faith in God.
