From time to time in my life, I get these "moments." Moments of reflection or inspiration or maybe a wake-up call. To tell you the truth, none of the aforementioned descriptions really pinpoint this special time of revelation and learning; it just happens.

Today I was in a grocery store that we visit far too often. As I was walking up and down the aisles on the hunt for items on my list...it happened! I took a right and turned into the potato chip aisle. From the moment I turned the cart (with the wobbly wheel), there were potato chips, as you might expect, packed four deep and four shelves high all the way down to the other end of the aisle (both sides). I didn't count the different types of chips or who made them: I was struck that "chips," not one of the main food groups, were given so much space. Why would any resident, citizen, alien, or visitor even want to have that many choices for chips? Do humans eat that many different styles of chips? There are breakfast chips, snack chips, lunch chips, and supper chips!

My thoughts spilled over to the other aisles, and I started to move up and down each of the well-worn paths between the counters, looking at all the choices we have in just one of the hundreds of stores in a 5-mile radius. Do I want sliced or baguette style? Flour or gluten-free? Maybe I would like potato bread, pita, multigrain, or pumpernickel. I haven't had cornbread in a while. I know I haven't had banana bread or flatbread either lately. I tell you what, today...I'm just going for the English muffin

# ABBY PERDEW AND ALEX PERDEW'S MISSION TRIP TO THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Sixteen high schoolers and five adults went on a mission trip to the Dominican Republic. The trip was sponsored by Village Chapel. Our own Abby Perdew and Alex Perdew were included in this worthwhile experience.

The people speak very little English and only know simple words. The group was accompanied by translators who had gone to school to be translators, and this was their job.

Abby stated it was an "eye-opening experience" for her. She felt that God was calling her out for her complaints about things in her life that the people in the Dominican don't have. She learned a valuable lesson: she should be grateful for what she has. She stated she can turn on the air conditioning because she is hot; people there do not have it because there is no central air. She also found them to have a great sense of community. The best part of the trip for her was her ministry work and the interaction with the children.

Alex felt it was really "eye-opening" that they can do the same things we do with fewer resources. They don't have fans to turn on at high speed. There are no luxuries. They have a VBS without elaborate decorations. It is kept very simple. Alex saw that these people do not have Bibles or any way to access the word of God. He enjoyed reading and explaining to really open up their faith, which led them to ask good questions that could further their connections to Christ. He enjoyed teaching about God and having Jesus in your life. They taught what it meant to accept Jesus as your Savior.

Abby and Alex were surprised you could give the children a box of chalk and a soccer ball, and they had the "time of their lives." They are happy to just have a pair of shoes, and unlike us, they don't care about the style.

Their church consisted of a Haitian church, that is not like ours. It is a building with plastic and fold-out chairs. The other was a Dominican church, held in a two-story house with three oscillating fans on the wall. Church was held on the entry floor. This is also where the group had their meals.

They did clear out a park so that they would be able to have church in the park.

The food mostly consisted of rice and beans. As time was coming to a close, Alex was surprised to have a favorite of Americans, hamburgers and fries.
